Health Services Advisory Committee Purpose	(Overview) Head Start Performance Standard requires having an advisory committee to meet two times per year. 6,000 Children countywide. SOP has 31 Centers.

<p>Special Presentation</p>	<p>Dr. Musser was unable to attend the meeting. SETA has a certificate of recognition for him.</p>		
<p>2013-2014 Program Information Report- PIR</p>	<p>Due: August 31 of each year.</p> <p>Statistical information on children. Summary Report on Head Start/Early Head Start Services: Children: 98% received medical screenings enrolled in Sacramento County. We are Up to Date on Oral Health Care: 85% received treatment.</p> <p>SmileKeepers is a dental program that provides visual dental screens on the children. Dental Hygienist comes out to do visual screens. Parent asked: What if a parent opts out? Ms. Campos replied: Counsel parent and if parent refuses and dental problem is severe, it may become a medical neglect issue.</p> <p>Immunizations: 100%</p>		

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	<p>Home Base Head Start requires children to be up to date on EPSDT screenings. Usually if a child is at Home Base Head Start option, there is no available slot at a center or the parents have a transportation issue.</p> <p>Home Base: Immunizations 81% EHS nurse clarified how EHS health requirements are a challenge in Home Base setting.</p> <p>Ms. Lee, Deputy Director stated that SETA's PIR percentages were on par for State and Region. No corrective action needed to be submitted by SETA.</p>

<p>Agency Updates</p>	<p>Covered CA: Open enrollment until February 15, 2015.</p> <p>CHDP: Immunizations and Obesity is a concern.</p> <p>SNAP Ed.: Provided education and free adult nutrition classes through Sacramento food bank and county services.</p> <p>SmileKeepers: Sutter extended hospital dentistry. 32-34 hours per month. The Denti-Cal audit was not very good. They are working on it. There isn't an increase in providers.</p> <p>Kaiser South; Dr. Cooke: Seeing a 5-6% increase in growth. 2/3 of patients are Medi-Cal participants. South Sacramento Kaiser is the busiest emergency room in the USA. They have a new "E-mail your Dr. service" where patients are able to e-mail their Dr. instead of having to come in to the emergency room or Dr. office for an appointment. There is a 20% refusal rate for vaccinations from parents for their</p>
